

A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

Who do YOU say I am? It is a piercing question from our gospel this weekend. A question that was asked of the disciples, the people who walked with Jesus Christ Himself. They have witnessed a few miracles already, they have come to hear his teaching, they watched him pray, and they walk with him.

Pope Francis led a reflection in 2014 on Peter and the disciples responses. Peter had courage, zeal, and strength, "satisfied within himself," thinking, "I answered well!". And truly, "he had answered well," the Pope said.

Jesus asks us the same question: Who do YOU say I am? We often have the courage, zeal, and strength like Peter to respond: You are my Savior, you are Lord, you are God, you are my everything. These are good responses; they are correct responses! So often we are able to respond in positive and affirming ways when Christ invites us, when life seems to go well.

Life of Discipleship is difficult. After this great confession by Peter, Jesus goes on to reveal how he is going to be mistreated and persecuted. Rightly so, Peter does not want Jesus to talk about that. Pope Francis goes on to say, "But Peter did not agree with what he was hearing; he did not like the path that Jesus set forth... For Peter did not understand the path of suffering that Jesus indicated. So much so, the Gospel tells us, that Peter took him and began to rebuke him. He was so pleased with having responded, "You are the Christ," that he felt he had the strength to rebuke Jesus."

Turns to the Disciples and rebukes Peter. A moment of humiliation. Peter went from the great response of calling Jesus Lord, and then Jesus rebuked him for saying the wrong thing a few moments later! For many, this could have been a moment when they turned and walked away. "I don't have to put up with this." "Who does he think he is?" This is a place where pride and ego start to seep in. Peter did not understand the full picture of what Jesus *needed* to do; even after the rebuke, Peter continued to walk with him.

Lifelong journey. Peter shows us the swings in our spiritual lives: from zeal, courage, and strength to pride, humility, and weakness. But it goes back to the question that Jesus asked the disciples: Who do YOU say I am? When Peter got that question right, everything revolved around that answer. Jesus asks that question of us also, and what is our response? It may be easy to answer with: Lord, God, Redeemer, Savior, but when it gets difficult, what is our response?

In the highs and the lows, Peter remained focused on Jesus Christ; he did not do it perfectly, but he always went back to Jesus. Our response matters to that question, as it is the anchor point to everything that we do in this life. Whether perfectly or imperfectly.

Blue Mass: On Wednesday, Sept. 11th, we celebrated a "Blue Mass" with the community and the school. It was a beautiful opportunity to thank our first responders and give them a special blessing! Thank you to our first responders and their families for their ministry in our community!

Faith Formation kickoff Mass was this past Wednesday, Sept. 11th as well. We had a nice showing of parents and youth as we began a new year of formation. I invite the parents to be the first and best catechist for their children and their family, and faith formation will supplement the faith of the Church for their child. For our youth, it is important that they grow in a relationship with Christ and His Church as they find their true happiness in Him: be authentic and genuine. Thank you for the many people who assist in raising our families in the faith!


