



A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

Greetings,

The role of a good role model in our lives is so important! When you were young, who did you look up to? Who did you want to model your life after? For a lot of children, they want to model their lives after their parents, their grandparents, their aunts, their uncles... As they grow up, the role model usually changes to a famous sports star, an actor or actress, a musician, a teacher, etc. Then ultimately the role model becomes a person with whom they associate great qualities, authenticity, groundedness, determination, etc.

Whether we want to admit it or not, we are looking up to someone, and someone is looking up to us. Two questions: who or what are you looking up to, and when someone looks up to you, what are they seeing? Those people in our lives that we look up to, our role models, have an impact on us—in our thoughts, our actions, and our words. Often, we try to imitate those we look up to; that is why it is important that we choose our role models well!

When someone looks up to you, what are they seeing? This is especially important for parents and grandparents; the little ones are always watching! A great joy for me as a priest is being able to distribute the Eucharist. I love being able to give Jesus' body to the faithful. I have seen parents who are busy with their children during Mass: trying to redirect their attention, stepping out while their child needs a moment to "pull it together," following along with the words in the music or the prayers, and passing their child to the nearest grandparent so they can have just a moment by themselves. And then the faithful come forward to receive the Eucharist. Our young people's eyes are GLUED to what is happening! As I hold the Eucharist in front of the parent and say, "Body of Christ," the parent responds with an "Amen." Children are fixated on what is happening!

This is an incredible witness to being a role model. Our young people are watching how important it is for their parents to receive the Eucharist. This is an important moment in the Mass, and it is the most important moment of the week! Parents don't be afraid to talk to your children about how important the Eucharist and going to Mass are in your life! Don't worry about saying the "right" words or saying the "wrong" thing but speak about a love for Jesus and the Eucharist. Our young people are looking for a good role model, one who is authentic, genuine, trustworthy, and faithful. Be a witness of Christ!

Priesthood Sunday is Sept. 29 (this Sunday). I remember Fr. Denny Dempsey from the Archdiocese of Minneapolis/St. Paul from when I was a child. He was our associate pastor when I was growing up. I do not remember much of the words he spoke, but I do remember his joy, his smile, and his humor. Even though I was young when I knew him, I look back and say that he is a man who loved Jesus and loved life! I am grateful for the role models that I have had in my life, especially for some of the priests who have had such an impact on my life and my call to the priesthood. Please continue to pray for good, healthy, happy, and holy priests, especially here in the Diocese of Crookston.

Thank you!! It takes a lot of people to make a parish festival work! Holy Rosary has had several people involved in getting our parish festival pulled together! Thank you for your generosity of time, talent, and treasure; know that we are truly grateful for all that you do!
