
Adoration Time Change



A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Happy 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time!

We are at a significant time in the calendar year. In the calendar year, many people are experiencing an ending and also a beginning. The Minnesota summer as we know it has come to an end, yet the Minnesota fall season is beginning. The three-month open schedule for school aged children and their parents has come to an end, shifting into the beginning of a specific routine during the school year for the next nine months. Soon, the marinas on the lake shore along with the summer cabins will be cleaned up and closed, beginning a form of hibernation in the months to come.

The deaf and mute man we heard in the Gospel reading today, also experienced an end and a beginning. Scripture reads...

"And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"—that is, "Be opened!"— And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly."

Today's scripture reading has similar elements of many healings throughout the Gospels. I am selecting the scripture in Luke's Gospel (5:17-26) of the paralyzed man. Here's a summary of the scripture: Some men, carrying a paralyzed man on a stretcher, could not find a way to reach Jesus in the house from the ground because of the large crowd. The men decided, because of their faith, to open the roof and lower the paralyzed man through the roof to be near Jesus. The paralyzed man was healed by Jesus and walked away from the house.

There are similar stories in scripture where the deaf, the mute and the paralyzed are brought to Jesus by "people" or "men." They had an ending of a physical disability and a new beginning that caused others to believe in Jesus. Those who brought these men to Jesus believed that Jesus can heal. This is what we are also called to do - to bring others to Jesus for healing.

Many men and women in our parish volunteer to lead elementary children, middle school and high school youth to meet Jesus through Wednesday evening Faith Formation Classes. Not that the students are sick or disabled, rather the volunteers believe in Jesus and desire to bring others to Jesus. Each boy and girl, young man and woman in Faith Formation received at their baptism a hunger to know God the Father. Parents, you brought your child to baptism and continue to be the first teachers of your child. Our parish and Faith Formation Volunteers support you in forming your children to know that Jesus is the ONE to satisfy that hunger, to know Him, love Him, encounter Him and continue a lifelong relationship with Jesus, becoming the person God planned each of them to be.

Consider a beginning... joining the Faith Formation Team to bring the youth of our parish to Jesus, just as the people and men we hear about in scripture did for their friends. You will receive blessings from God the Father for your witness to the Faith Formation Students. The fruits of your work, with the help of the Holy Spirit, may not be immediately visible, but over time you will see the goodness of these youth in cooperation with the Holy Spirit. Come join the Faith Formation Team.


