



A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Welcome to the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The church liturgical year is passing quickly; soon we enter Advent, the Sunday following Thanksgiving Day Holiday. Begin preparing yourself to transition from one liturgical year to the next. We are presently hearing gospel readings from Mark, and then beginning December 1st we begin the new liturgical year hearing the gospel readings from Luke.

Recently, Pope Francis released, on October 24, 2024, an Encyclical Letter "On the Human and Divine Love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus"

The letter references scripture relating to human hearts. The first reference to scripture are the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Paragraph 4 from the letter... "The disciples of Emmaus, on their mysterious journey in the company of the risen Christ, experienced a moment of anguish, confusion, despair, and disappointment. Yet, beyond and in spite of this, something was happening deep within them: "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road?" (Lk 24:32)."

Another scripture reference is that of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Paragraph 19 from the letter... "The heart is also capable of unifying and harmonizing our personal history, which may seem hopelessly fragmented, yet is the place where everything can make sense. The Gospel tells us this in speaking of Our Lady, who saw things with the heart. She was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory, and viewing them from a greater perspective. The best expression of how the heart thinks is found in the two passages in Saint Luke's Gospel that speak to us of how Mary "treasured (synetérei) all these things and pondered (symbállousa) them in her heart" (cf. Lk 2:19 and 51). The Greek verb symbállein, "ponder," evokes the image of putting two things together ("symbols") in one's mind and reflecting on them in a dialogue with oneself. In Luke 2:51, the verb used is dietérei, which has the sense of "keep." What Mary "kept" was not only her memory of what she had seen and heard, but also those aspects of it that she did not yet understand; these nonetheless remained present and alive in her memory, waiting to be "put together" in her heart."

These two paragraphs reveal how the human heart responds to situations. The disciples from paragraph 4 experienced anguish, confusion, despair, and disappointment until Jesus reveals himself to them in the breaking of the bread.

The Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady, saw things with the heart. She was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory, and viewing them in greater perspective. The heart is also capable of unifying and harmonizing our personal history, which may seem hopelessly fragmented, yet is the place where everything can make sense. The Gospel tells us this in speaking of Our Lady, who saw things with the heart, nonetheless remained present and alive in her memory, waiting to be "put together" in her heart.

The hearts of the disciples walking to Emmaus looked at their immediate situation without looking back or looking forward. If they had looked back, Jesus explained everything to them about these days of His arrest, death, and resurrection. They lacked all hope. Jesus walked with them to again teach the big picture from the scriptures. Remember, what we call "The Old Testament" is all they had available to refer to, and Jesus reminded them of all the scriptures that foreshadowed His life.

The Blessed Mother, on the other hand, was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory, and viewing them in greater perspective. The key words here include "pondering, pondering, treasure, keeping, keeping." The Blessed Mother was exposed to the same teachings as the Disciples on the road to Emmaus, yet see how differently she responds.

The Blessed Mother experienced the same situation that may seem hopelessly fragmented, yet she is in a place where everything in her heart was "put together." How much may we learn from the Blessed Mother to further understand our own hearts in perspective of the situations at hand in our own lives?

Lastly, remember always, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart," as we heard in today's Gospel.

"And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all the burnt offerings and sacrifices." (MARK 12:33)

Of all the gifts that God gives us, the one He wants the most is our heart. He wants us to share out of our love for Him, not out of obligation. Using our talent in parish ministry and contributing money to support our parish mission is important, but it's more important to spend time in prayer with God daily and discern how He is calling us to be generous with all of our gifts. Not just the visible ones, but the invisible ones like love, mercy and forgiveness.


