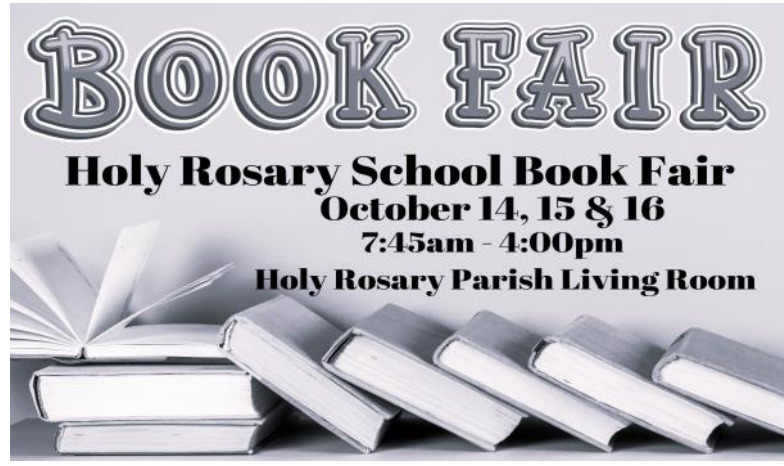


The Holy Father's Prayer Intention for October

A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

Indeed the Word of God is living and effective is the line that we hear in our second reading this weekend! It is a refreshing line to hear! One of the great temptations that we face is that we can give into discouragement about whether God's Word is still alive and working. A way in which this temptation starts to creep in is through a simple question, "Does God even hear me?" We ask this through prayer, in conversations with others, and in our thoughts. Occasionally, we really start to believe it, and then we start to go down the road of disparagement.

To hear those Words again in our second reading is to give us hope, joy, and excitement as we live and pray with those Words!! God's Word is living, it is effective, and He is still moving today! The word "Gospel" translates to "good news"! Not meant to disparage us, but to give us hope, joy, and mission.

It can be easy to hear a lot of negative news or stories. When we hear these stories, they can really have an impact of us in a way that invites us towards negativity. We also know that when we hear positive stories, they can really have an impact on us also. They can give us joy, they can uplift our spirits, and they can also help us change some of our habits or the ways we do things.

Holy Rosary has Good News! There are many positive stories that are happening here and in our community. While it is true that we have some challenges, some things to be critical of, we also have some things to rejoice in!

One of the incredible ministries that is offered is Emmaus. Parishioners are out at people's homes, in the hospital, in the nursing homes, and in places of assisted living bringing our people who are unable to come to Mass the Eucharist. This is a rich and beautiful ministry!

OCIA (formerly RCIA) has some great stories of how people have been invited to seek out their relationship with the Lord in the Catholic Church. On the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month, we gather as a group to talk about the teachings of the Church, to open Scriptures, to talk about prayer, and to study history. We have a great group of people that are currently enrolled in OCIA as they journey towards deciding about whether to join the Church!

Holy Rosary had three women who chose to make a Cursillo on the weekend of Sept. 26th-29th. These women had a great encounter with the Lord, with a great community, and get to keep the spirit of the weekend up when they join a small group. These Cursillo groups are a place of strength and renewal for people who are seeking to live holy lives that are centered on the Gospel.

We have so many reasons to share the Good News! Holy Rosary has a lot of beautiful conversions that are happening in large ways and in small ways! Continue to celebrate those victories, those moments when we choose Christ for indeed, "the Word is living and effective!"

Thank you!!! Our parish festival was a wonderful hit!! Jamie McDougall and a small group of leaders helped organize a beautiful event that gave us a reason to gather as a community. Mass outside, bingo, kid's games, marketplace, food...it was all a hit! Thank you to everyone who helped and to all those who participated in the events; it was a great Sunday afternoon!
