

A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

"Take courage; get up Jesus is calling you!" is a beautiful line that we hear in the gospel this weekend. Jesus' invitation is still out for us to take courage and follow him! It is amazing when we reflect on those moments in our life when we have trusted Him, taken that, and followed Him. We didn't always know where that would lead, what that would require of us, or what the outcome would be, but we knew we needed to take that step. In looking back, we can see those moments where grace has assisted and affirmed us in taking that step.

I have seen such moments at Holy Rosary. On Sunday, October 13th, I saw a community show up for the marathon! It was so beautiful to walk out of the Welcoming Center doors and to see so many families and friends gather in the parking lot! We had cooler weather and a lot of wind, but it didn't matter. There was a lot of courage shown to be able to show up and participate in the marathon. When walking away from the events of the day, I was amazed and uplifted by the community and the support they showed for each other and for the school!

A beautiful ministry in the community is Teams of Our Lady. The team that I am a chaplain for has 5 married couples that gathered for some social time, a great meal, prayer, accountability, and learning. It was a chance for the couples to focus on their marriage in an intentional way as they support one another. Marriage takes a lot of work, and it takes the help and support of others. This was a great moment of watching the Lord continue to work in and through the sacrament of Holy Matrimony.

As the summer was winding down and the school year was getting ready, personnel from Catholic schools across the diocese gathered in East Grand Forks for a day-long conference. It was a wonderful conference that reinforced the ministry of Catholic education. Every teacher, support aide, principal, specials teacher, front desk secretary, and priest has a role to play in the lives of the children and families that come through our schools. We have the beautiful gift of being able to teach in words and actions that very life of Jesus Christ as we invite them to be disciples!

Our parish festival was a highlight for me this fall! We had incredible weather that allowed us to do the Mass on Lake Ave. People were able to eat some tasty food and enjoy good conversations. The bingo area was busy all day long, the kids' games were a hit, and the marketplace was wonderful! One of the greatest parts of the parish festival is to watch a community gather in good spirits. It was a great place to catch up with other people and enjoy the outdoors.

As neighbors and friends, please plan to attend this special Mass. Be aware and be present in our community as we remember the great souls who have gone before us.




Your Change Can Change Lives
