

A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Welcome to the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The front page of the bulletin from the 31st Sunday referenced Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter released on October 24, 2024. In the beginning of the letter, Pope Francis shared two examples of how the heart responds. The first example is walking with the disciples on the road to Emmaus. The disciples were blind to seeing Jesus walking with them until Jesus blessed and broke the bread, then their hearts were open to Him. The disciples response, "Were not our hearts burning within us!"

The second example of the heart is that of our Blessed Mother, Mary. Mary saw things with her heart; she was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory, and viewing them from a greater perspective. This latter example is preferred as the Blessed Mother is in loving communion with Jesus. From paragraph 26, Pope Francis expands on St. Henry Newman's perspectives of the heart. "Saint John Henry Newman took as his motto the phrase Cor ad cor loquitur, since, beyond all our thoughts and ideas, the Lord saves us by speaking to our hearts from his Sacred Heart. This realization led him, the distinguished intellectual, to recognize that his deepest encounter with himself and with the Lord came not from his reading or reflection but from his prayerful dialogue, heart to heart, with Christ, alive and present. It was in the Eucharist that Newman encountered the living heart of Jesus, capable of setting us free, giving meaning to each moment of our lives, and bestowing true peace: 'O most Sacred, most loving Heart of Jesus, Thou art concealed in the Holy Eucharist, and Thou beatest for us still... I worship Thee then with all my best love and awe, with my fervent affection, with my most subdued, most resolved will.'

There is a common practice that our Blessed Mother and St. John Henry Newman gravitate to: prayerful dialogue, heart to heart, with Christ, alive and present. We read from paragraph 27 of the letter, "Before the heart of Jesus, living and present, our mind, enlightened by the Spirit, grows in the understanding of his words, and our will is moved to put them into practice. Only the heart is capable of setting our other powers and passions, and our entire person, in a stance of reverence and loving obedience before the Lord." These words are rich in understanding of how to grow in relationship with Jesus. Taking the time as our Blessed Mother and St. John Henry Newman did to "ponder" or "prayerful dialogue, heart to heart, with Christ." For both of them, this points to being in the presence of Jesus.

For many Catholics, attending Mass is our obligation, though after further "pondering" or "prayerful dialogue," the obligation changes to a desire to be with the Son of God, the Creator of the World, in greater frequency and spend more loving time with Him. Paragraph 29 expands on this. "Taking the heart seriously then has consequences for society as a whole. The Second Vatican Council teaches that 'every one of us needs a change of heart; we must set our gaze on the whole world and look to those tasks we can all perform together in order to bring about the betterment of our race.' 'The imbalances affecting the world today are in fact a symptom of a deeper imbalance rooted in the human heart.' In pondering the tragedies afflicting our world, the Council urges us to return to the heart. It explains that human beings 'by their interior life transcend the entire material universe; they experience this deep interiority when they enter into their own heart, where God, who probes the heart, awaits them, and where they decide their own destiny in the sight of God.

Did you catch that last sentence? Here it is again... Read it slowly: "Human beings, by their interior life, transcend the entire material universe; they experience this deep interiority when they enter into their own heart, where God, who probes the heart, awaits them, and where they decide their own destiny in the sight of God." God is desiring to be with all of us in the journey of life, though it is not until we each give Him the space, time, and attention to welcome Him into our journey is He able to lead us to become the person that He has planned for each of us to be. This week, consider spending 15 minutes each day to "ponder" in prayerful dialogue, heart to heart, with Christ, alive and present, to transcend the entire material universe to experience deeply, entering into your own heart where God awaits.
