A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

Christ the King weekend gives me the chance to look back on a trip that I took 7 years ago. I was fortunate to be able to travel to London for 10 days with my classmates that I was studying with in seminary. During our time we traveled around to see many of the significant sites that people would expect to see: Westminster Abbey, Big Ben clock tower, Tower of London, and many other sites.

One of the beautiful and unique sites is the Tower of London. While walking through, one of the main attractions is the Queen's Jewels. It is here that we saw magnificent crowns, orbs, and rings. It was dark, but at the same time the items were lit up, and it was like they were glowing. I remember walking through Westminster Abbey and seeing the monuments for States people and other famous people that have died. Large, ornate windows surrounded by concrete and painted designs. It almost takes a person's breath away when walking into it!

A Shift occurred for me when I was walking through these beautiful spaces, seeing some of the most elegant designs ever made, and they still felt empty. While they were beautiful to look at and spend time with, I walked away feeling almost sad. All the jewels, all the glitz, all the glamour, and yet it was lacking in depth. In the end, this too will pass.

I took a day trip to Littlemore. At Littlemore, St. John Henry Newman studied and led small groups in the study of faith, and this is the place where he became Catholic. I walked into his library, where they have preserved his desk and some of his books, and my mind immediately went to seeing him work at this desk! This is the place where some of the most influential words were ever written and lived out! After walking through the library, we went into his chapel. It was a dark space; a large curtain hung against the wall, and only a few spaces were available for people to sit. We were able to have Mass, and for the first time since I had been in London, I had experienced so much peace and joy! It was in this moment that I realized the true depth in simplicity! There was not much to look at, but what was there moved the mind and imagination to the beauty of heaven!

Christ the King is more than the beauty of our earthly, material world. The beauty of His creation does have much to offer: woods, lakes, art, mountains, pottery, animals, etc. The beauty of Himself and how He draws us towards the heavenly kingdom is simply breathtaking! Those moments when we realize that there is *something* more than what the eyes can see, but the beauty of the One who uses it to draw us to Himself. May we have the courage to follow Christ the King as He draws us to the heavenly kingdom!

Have a great Thanksgiving! Wherever you find yourselves over the Thanksgiving weekend, may you take the opportunity to pray a prayer of gratitude for all that God has done and is doing in all our lives. One of the great prayers that we can pray is "thank you"!
