A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

"Behold, I come to do your will" is the theme for our last weekend of Advent. In these final days of preparation, may your prayer be similar to the author of Hebrews!

Sometimes praying these words come easy, sometimes they are a bit more difficult. Moments when it can come easy: looking for a change in career, in family relationships, conversations with neighbors, when something presents itself as a great opportunity that you weren't expecting, etc. Making that shift, doing the Will of God, can come easy and discernment is easy: this is a good choice and I am going to make it! Often this can be accompanied with feelings of peace, relief, happiness, accomplishment, and purpose. Praying the prayer, "Lord let your Will be done" is a prayer of joy!

Allowing the Lord's will to be done can also be a challenge. We know that it can be a challenge when we don't know what the future holds, maybe He is asking me to make a change in something that I am doing, letting go of a habit or a lifestyle that I do not want to change, etc. There is something that is different about our human nature when we trust in God rather than trusting in ourselves. When it is a challenge to do what the Lord is inviting us to, we feel uncomfortable, anxious, angry, resentful, stubborn, etc. In life, in this world, it seems that I know what I can control and what I can't control, and I want the things that I can control! Surrendering to God's Will is a challenge because I am not the one in control, and that makes me feel uncomfortable.

How am I supposed to know whether I am doing what the Lord wants me to do? First, have you had that conversation with the Lord? Often a temptation is that we go our way, do our thing, go about my business, and then ask the Lord to bless it. What about a shift in the order: Lord, bless this day and the things that YOU want today. Second, are you open to conversion-open to change? Sometimes we can find ourselves in a good rhythm, life is going well, and I don't want things to change; but what might the Lord be inviting you to do?

We can get into a rhythm or pattern and lose sight that I don't want to change. Third, use the words at the bottom of the Divine Mercy image: Jesus, I trust in You. One of the challenges to do the Will of the Lord is not being able to trust that the Lord will watch over and guide us. For the moments when you are struggling to trust, when you don't want to do the Will of the Lord, when you are anxious, pray with the Divine Mercy: Jesus, I trust in You.

Our readings for this weekend are beautiful witnesses to that trust in saying "YES" to the Lord. It is not always easy, but it is always good! Looking at the gospel reading, Elizabeth and Mary serve as witnesses, as Saints that can guide us in saying yes. Ask for their prayers, for their assistance to guide you in the ways of the Lord. They understand our struggles and want what is best for us in accord with the Lord's Will. Allow them to be role models!

Daily Masses: On Thursday, Dec 26 and Friday, Dec 27th, I will have daily Mass at 8:30. The offices are closed so staff can celebrate with their loved ones.

Merry Christmas! Our Christmas Masses will be December 24th at 4:00 pm and 9:00 pm, and on December 25th at 10:00 am. This is a beautiful opportunity to join in community around the manger where Christ, Mary, and Joseph are waiting to greet us! This is our opportunity to give back to the Lord the gratitude for ALL that He has done for us; to say "thank you" for coming to earth to be with us! May you have joy and peace at Christ's coming within you during this Christmas season!


