Family is where the earthly journey for Jesus began, surrounded by the two most important people in his life on earth, Mary and Joseph. December 29th, 2024

The coming of Jesus, the God Man, demonstrates to God's children, you and me, the highest degree of love our God has for us. God sent His son, Jesus, disguised in human flesh to rescue us, His children, from the lies, deception and divider of Satan and his minions. Satan knows Jesus is God, yet Satan is not fully able to recognize Jesus as God due to the camouflage Jesus is wearing... human flesh. Satan is continually deceived by Jesus, up to the moment Jesus reveals himself to Satan from the cross, when Jesus says in the face of Satan, "It is finished." What does this mean? The chains and bondage of Satan on God's children is no more. Jesus takes on all our sins to free us from Satan's grasp. One key component in this is that we must surrender to God's will in our lives, otherwise the death and resurrection of Jesus may not have an effect to be rescued by Jesus. This is how much God loves us, His children, you and me, to restore our relationship to God the Father.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque reported a series of apparitions of Christ between December 1673 and June 1675. The following words are from an Encyclical Letter by Pope Francis published on, October 24, 2024, paragraphs 119-124.

"Fundamental (the foundation) to these was a declaration of love that stood out in the first apparition. Jesus said: "My divine Heart is so inflamed with love for men, and for you in particular, that, no longer able to contain in itself the flames of its ardent charity, it must pour them out through you and be manifested to them, in order to enrich them with its precious treasures which I now reveal to you".

Most essential in the first apparition is Jesus' declaration of love to St. Margaret Mary that she is able pour out Jesus' love to others. Reflecting on those people in my life that have passed on to be with God, many names come to mind that they were also a vessel pouring His (Jesus) divine Heart of love out to me and many others.

Pope Francis continues to write, from St. Margaret Mary, "He revealed to me the ineffable (overwhelming) wonders of his pure love and to what extremes it had led him to love mankind." St. Margaret Mary continues, "This is the heart that so loved human beings that it has spared nothing, even to emptying and consuming itself in order to show them its love."

"It is necessary that the divine heart of Jesus in some way replace our own; that he alone live and work in us and for us; that his will... work absolutely and without any resistance on our part; and finally that its affections, thoughts and desires take the place of our own, especially his love, so that he is loved in himself and for our sakes. And so, this lovable heart being our all in all, we can say with Saint Paul that we no longer live our own lives, but it is he who lives within us".

St. Margaret Mary writes with definitive words, "He asked for my heart, which I asked him to take, which he did and then placed myself in his own adorable heart, from which he made me see mine like a little atom consumed in the fiery furnace of his own".

These words from St. Margaret Mary and Pope Francis, greatly reinforce the message of Christmas. The message of Christmas love is not in words, but rather an action by God through the fleshly birth of the Son of God, Jesus.
