

Letter from Fr. Nate Brunn

One of my favorite artists is James Tissot. Tissot is a French artist from the 19th century that had an incredible talent for detail. He used rich, vibrant colors that really popped. Much of his works involving the life of Christ emphasize the use of white and the movement of light in his works. Something that was very important to him was accuracy in how he presented the characters and the scene.

One of the paintings that he did is called, "The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple". It is a beautiful image that invites you into the Presentation as one of the spectators, a person in the crowd. Our eyes are drawn to the middle where there is a set of steps and people standing at the top. Because we know the story, we know that it is Joseph holding a cage with two pigeons and Mary is next to him. Simeon, the priest at Temple, is offering the child to God. Our eyes are drawn to the exchange between the parents of the child, the priest, and the child.

What I found interesting about this piece is the crowd. When you start to look around the painting, there are a lot of people that are involved. Some people are having a conversation, some seem to be laughing or mocking, some have their back turned to the event, some are facing the event-looking at what is happening, and one person seems to be praising God. There are a lot of different reactions for the people in the crowd.

At the heart of what is happening, Jesus is presented in the Temple to God for the people to see! For some people that is the moment they have been waiting their whole life for! I think about Simeon offering Jesus in this moment, knowing that he is holding the Son of God. Another person recognizes the presence of God in their midst and lifts their arms and hands to God in praise! This is a great moment of rejoicing as they recognize God among them!

At the same time, there were many who were apathetic or not recognizing God's presence among them. Amid their busy-ness, their normal routine, they missed God's gift in front of them. Some people were mocking or laughing at those who were praising God. Tissot used the tactic of showing how their backs were turned to the scene.

When we enter the scene of the Presentation of Jesus, where do we find ourselves? We might be standing with Joseph and Mary, with Simeon, or another person praising God. Other times we might find ourselves being too busy to stop and see God's presence among us. Sometimes we might be the people mocking or laughing at the event and those who are praising God. Wherever we find ourselves, the Lord is always inviting us to look back to Him. Moments in which we stop what we are doing and look to Jesus! Moments when we recognize God is present, He is with us! Moments when we stand up for Jesus rather than make fun of Him or the Church. Moments when we get to stand next to Mary and Joseph and be supported by their prayers! These are the small moments that the Lord uses to look at Him, to turn to Him and recognize His presence among us!

Adoration at the Capitol Dcn Gary is going to the State Capitol in St. Paul this upcoming Friday for a day of Adoration. On the 1st Friday's of the month, MCC (Minnesota Catholic Conference) hosts adoration at the capitol. This is an opportunity to pray for our state leaders and for our state. If you are interested in going, Dcn Gary is arranging for everyone to go—please reach out to him and he will make sure everyone is accounted for! Thank you for your prayers for our government leaders.

"Because he himself was tested through what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested." Hebrews 2:18

When we join a support group, there is comfort in sharing our pain with people who have experienced the same thing; they understand what we are going through. The next time you experience suffering, talk to Jesus. He has experienced more suffering than most of us. He understands. Plus, Jesus knows us better than we know ourselves. Only He an fill the hole you fill in your heart.
