

A Letter from Fr. Nate Brunn

The Many Gifts! We have such a unique, great, wonderful God! When He created us He created each one of us so different that no two people are the same. Each one of us is created in the likeness and image of God, and at the same time each human person and soul is completely different. We likely heard a lot when we were young, "you are unique!" or "there is only one of YOU in the world!" As we grow older, as families and friends grow, we certainly realize how true that is.

Those difficult middle and high school years are often spent trying to figure their own uniqueness or their talents, and at the same time trying to blend and fit in wherever they can. As we become adults, the discovery is not so much how am I unique but rather how am I complemented. This is where we see two unique personalities or characteristics that are vastly different but go well together; where one has a strength, another has a weakness and then vice versa.

Three pillars that were a part of human formation when I was in seminary were: self-knowledge, self-acceptance, and self-gift. These three pillars were adapted from St. John Paul II's writings, but they apply well when looking at our strengths and our weaknesses. When I know myself and accept what I can and cannot do, I know what to do and what not to do. In pulling this together with the 2nd reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, Paul identifies that the Lord gives different talents and strengths to different people; not everybody gets the same thing! With that, St. Paul wants to emphasize the importance of knowing our unique gifts that God gives to you and to me. When we know the gifts that God has given us, we can use them for some incredible things that God has planned only for you to do! Some gifts are in communication, organization, being crafty, having a listening presence, being optimistic, athletic, etc. Our gifts range wide and far! With that we also have weaknesses that need support from others. That is the reason why self-knowledge AND self-acceptance are important; they both work in how God wants to use each one of us!




Please welcome John Wilke, our new Parish Administrator at **Holy Rosary!**
