

A Message From Fr. Nate

#### **Barren Bush or Fruitful Tree**

Our 1<sup>st</sup> reading this weekend from Jeremiah gives us two images: a barren bush or a fruitful tree. The barren bush: one who trusts in human beings more than God, finds strength in themselves more than in reliance on the power of God, and one who has turned their back on God. The fruitful tree: trusts in God, their hope is in the Lord and perseveres in faith through difficulties. Whew...

Given those two images, I know which one I would like to choose! The image of a fruitful tree is certainly the image that I would like to aim for. It is amazing though how quickly and how subtle it can shift from a fruitful tree to a barren bush. It seems that there are moments when faith, trust, hope, charity, etc. all seem to come easy. The spiritual term that we connect with that is consolation. These are the moments when it feels like God is right next to us and prayer is like sweet drops of honey! These are the moments when it feels like I am a fruitful tree.

Eventually the consolation wears away and God feels distant. Sometimes it occurs because of tragedy, a difficult decision or moment that didn't go the way a person thought it would, get too busy or caught up doing other things that one loses intentional prayer time, etc. Then, when spending some time in reflection, one starts to think, "I am a barren bush; I feel spiritually dried up."

Lent is just around the corner! Ash Wednesday is March 5<sup>th</sup>. Lent is a time that invites us into the desert to spend time with Christ in a very intentional way. Our time in the desert at Lent is not meant to dry us up, but to feed us to be a fruitful tree. Lent is a time that can invite us to refocus and look at those moments in how one has drifted away from the Lord and turned toward themselves. Start thinking NOW about your upcoming Lent: what are some ways that you have been a barren bush (ways that you have turned away from God)-regular prayer, Mass, gratitude, pride... And what are ways that you can revitalize your faith, trust, hope, charity-through prayer, penance, and almsgiving. DON'T LET LENT SNEAK UP ON YOU! Start praying now about how you can be a fruitful tree this upcoming Lent!

> Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Catholic Montessori based religious education method for children where they listen to and speak with God in a prepared environment called the atrium. Holy Rosary's atrium is in the basement of the church. The atrium is a place for children to pray and contemplate the mystery of God through hands on materials made just for them, that are rooted in scripture and the Mass. The catechist and the catechist assistant aid the child in their work in the atrium to help them form a friendship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd.
