





February 9, 2025 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message From Deacon Gary

Welcome to the Fifth Week in Ordinary Time.

This week we hear testimonials from two men in the scripture readings. One man walked with Jesus for three years, and the other man experienced Jesus walking with him. These may not be St. Peter or St. Paul's actual testimonials, yet we get a picture of their lifestyles, before they encountered Jesus.

Do you have a "Jesus testimonial" prepared to share when a conversation leads you to share the encounter that changed your life?

To help you out, let's recall the testimonial from St. Paul in the reading today. St. Paul precedes these words with a list of people that Jesus appeared to before appearing to him:

"Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he (Jesus) appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God, I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God that is with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed."

Hear these words from St. Paul, "not fit to be called an apostle; by the grace of God I am what I am; not I... but the grace of God that is with me." Are these words vibrating or ringing within you about your own life? They are for me.

Shifting to St. Peter's testimonial which is short and to the point:

"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

St. Peter, formerly Simon, was struck by the great quantity of fish caught in their nets to recognize Jesus is the Christ, the anointed one, the Messiah who the Jewish people have been watching for to rescue them from oppression of civic leaders. In this scripture, Jesus has the last word:

"Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him."

These testimonials of St. Peter and St. Paul are a report of their encounter with Jesus that shifted the direction of their lives, giving them new life. Are you ready to help others to know Jesus... to walk with others to help navigate a shift in their lives?


Helping others encounter Jesus is the vision of Bishop Cozzens pastoral letter for each of us, including you, in the Diocese of Crookston. The pastoral letter is titled, "New Life Through the Tender Compassion of Our God." New Life best describes the change for St. Peter and St. Paul. They encountered Jesus and had a New Life. Bishop Cozzens writes the pastoral letter from his own experiences of having New Life when he surrendered his life to Jesus as a college student.


