

A Message From Fr. Nate

A moment of Grace. On Friday, Feb 21st, a group of priests from the Diocese of Crookston got together at St. Philips in Bemidji. It was an evening that allowed us to have supper, hang around, and have good conversations. As priests, we don't always get these opportunities to chat informally about what is going on at each other's parishes. The night was centered around the topic of parishes being a center of mission.

As priests were sharing, it allowed me the opportunity to reflect on my experience here at Holy Rosary and to think towards the future. I was sharing some "glory-stories" about ministry and how people are involved and many of the great resources that are available. I also started to think toward the future and what Holy Rosary would look and feel like. It was a very idealistic and very rose-colored glasses moment. At that time, I found myself starting to smile as well!

I remember back to my college days. That was a time for me of great spiritual growth as I was wrestling with big faith questions. A moment that was a turning point was when I was having supper with a friend. He was someone involved in his faith life: prayed regularly, praise and worship music, go to talks and meetings, treated people well, etc. At the time when we met for supper, I was trying to figure out why I wanted to be Catholic-or if I didn't want to be. We sat in the dining hall for over 2 hours talking about life: faith, school, sports... It took a turn when he asked me, "why do you still go to Mass?" I was fumbling for words and trying to understand how to come up with a good answer, but all that came out was, "I'm not sure, but I think that it is the Eucharist". I went on to talk about how important that was for me when I go to Mass, "There are times when I go to other churches, but no one else has the Eucharist." As soon as I said those words, I could feel my heart and my soul relax; they were at peace. It was really at this moment that I came to realize the love I have for the Church and for the Mass.

A few days after our conversation, I invited him to Mass; he was unable to go. The next week he came to my room and asked if we could go together. From then on, we would go to Mass together. These small moments, small conversations that happen are moments of invitation, moments of grace; for us and for the ones we are talking to. The conversation deepened my faith and his faith too!

Our conversation on Friday evening invited me to think back to those small moments of responding to God's invitation to talk about faith, the Church, God, morality, and things that truly matter! These are the small moments when evangelization is happening, and I didn't plan for it that way but it just happened! "Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." The Lord is using these moments for good—for others and for you!

Ash Wednesday is March 5th (this week!). Mass is at 9:00 am and 6:00 pm. Use this as an opportunity to pray for others, to deepen your prayer life, to sacrifice for the sake of greater good, to abstain from those things that are holding us back from pursuing greatness, and to give to those who are most in need. Allow this Lent to be a great Lent as you seek to grow in your spiritual life through thoughts, deeds, and prayer. Have a great start to your Lent!


