LENT 2025

Fasting and Abstinence

Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Abstinence is observed by all who are 14 vears of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.


Good Friday, April 18, is a day of fasting and abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all who are 18 years of age or older who have not vet celebrated their 59th birthday. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

Chrism Mass

The Chrism Mass will be held at Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on April 14 at 6:30 p.m. Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives of each parish receive the blessed oils and then take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. We hope that this Lent will be a Lent that changes you and pushes you to grow deeper in your faith and that Easter is a bursting of New Life brought forth!

A Message From Deacon Gary

Happy 3rd Sunday of Lent! How is your Lent going after two and half weeks? Fr. Nate provided a wonderful picture of the progression of the readings last Sunday during his homily that begins with the three staples of Lent, "Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving" on Ash Wednesday. Followed by the Gospel reading on the 1st Sunday of Lent where Jesus was praying and fasting in the desert for 40 Days being close to God, like Moses experienced with God being in the burning bush in the Old Testament account. After the 40 days, the tempter, Satan, came forth attempting to destroy the goodness of those 40 days Jesus had in the desert with God the Father with basic human desires, such as food, power and worshiping something other than God. Then Satan departed, due to his failure, for a time. Satan will return later in the life of Jesus.

The 2nd Sunday of Lent we heard of Jesus, Peter, John and James ascending the mountain to initially pray, eventually the scene changed where Moses and Elijah were conversing with Jesus. Peter was so overwhelmed by the presence of these three, he desired to make the moment last by making three tents, one for each of them. The scripture writer explained it well, "He (Peter) did not know what he was saying." Let's reflect further on this statement from Peter. What if he could make 3 tents for these men?

Fr. Nate repeatedly used the word "intentional" during last Sunday's homily. Peter was intentional and desired to hold onto this good moment in time. How about you? Are there moments in time that you "intentionally" hold on to? This is where I understood Fr. Nate taking the homily: you can have time that is "intentional." This Lent is made for you to be "intentional" to grow in your relationship with Jesus for a lifetime, not just for a moment as Peter was desiring.

Fr. Nate provided several directions to be intentional this Lent, and I will focus on one. Begin with "being" rather than "doing." Being with Jesus. Peter wanted to make three tents. We at Holy Rosary have a large, heated brick building that houses Jesus. If anything would make Peter jealous, it's a building like we have. Making a tent is small potatoes after the resurrection.

Be intentional such as "being." Come, enter the church and rest quietly with Jesus. He desires for you to be in His presence. Do nothing. The greatest gift you can give Jesus is your time with Him and with no distractions. It may be hard the first several times when you are with Jesus because you're not wired to do nothing which is a result of our culture. Satan may tempt you with the idea, "your value is in what you do." That is a lie!!! Your value is already determined at your baptism... you are a Child of God!!! Remember what God said when Jesus was baptized... "This is my beloved son with whom I am well pleased." God says those same words to every person at their baptism, "You are my beloved daughter with whom I am well please." "You are my beloved son with whom I am well pleased." God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit desire to be with you. Come to the church and "BE" with Jesus. When you are with Jesus you are also with God the Father and God the Holy Spirit. Recognize your identity... You are a Child of God. Be intentional to live out your relationship with the good, gracious, merciful and kind God in the presence of Jesus.
