Chrism Mass


The Chrism Mass will be held at Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on April 14 at 6:30 p.m. Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives of each parish receive the blessed oils and then take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. We hope this Lent will be a Lent that changes you and pushes you to grow deeper in your faith and that Easter is a bursting of New Life brought forth!

A Message From Deacon Gary

Welcome to the 5th Sunday of Lent. We have another week to work on perfecting our way of living that is aligned with the life of Jesus. Keep in mind, aligning our life with Christ is a lifetime project. One 40-day period of Lent in 2025 is not the end of the journey to perfecting ourselves. Next Sunday we begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion.

Today many people may not be in union with the life of Jesus due to inner challenges because of sin, causing a degree of spiritual death. What is a spiritual death? Having little or no hope that we can become a Saint in the future. The one person that does offer hope in each of our lives is Jesus. There are many Saints who struggled with spiritual death, yet the hope of knowing Jesus changed everything for the person, leading them to Sainthood. One example in scripture is the woman caught in adultery and brought by the scribes and Pharisees to get a "ruling" from Jesus about this woman. Jesus makes this statement, "let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus said the quiet truth out loud: everyone is a sinner. As a result, the crowd slowly went away leaving Jesus and the woman alone. The love Jesus has for the woman is reflected in the final verses... Jesus says, "woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "no one sir." Then Jesus said, "neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." The woman is freed from the weight of her sin. We don't know if she became a Saint but check out the life of Dorothy Day (1897-1980). She is a Blessed on the journey to possible Sainthood or the life of St. Camillus de Lellis (1550-1614). Both people experienced difficult sins in their lives and found mercy and hope.

A Couple of Updates....

Lenten Small Groups wrapped up this past week completing the fourth session. Now we begin the journey to Walk with One, taking what we learned from the first three sessions. 1) What does it mean to encounter Christ? 2) Authentic Discipleship and 3) Living Authentic Community. The fourth session provides a path to Walk with One by: A) In prayer, identify someone who you are called to walk with over the next few weeks/months. B) Pray Intercessory prayers for this person and yourself. C) Determine how you will connect with the person. D) Accompany this person into a deeper relationship with Jesus. When you have the first positive experience, where a person accepts Jesus, you will desire to journey with more people to experience the loving mercy of Jesus and His Father.

Asheville, NC Mission Trip – At the writing of this, we have 15 people committed for the June 8-14 mission trip. There are 5 spots still available for the trip. Presently, 10 adults and 5 youth with an equal number of men and women are signed up to attend. The next step is to fundraise to defray the \$800 per person expenses. Our first goal is to have the youth portion of the trip paid in full and then fundraise any additional money to help defray adult expenses. Many adults are using work vacation time to help with the Hurricane Helene recovery. Please consider donating at the church office or via the OR Code.

Look for our mission trip group fundraising projects in the near future.

A Catechist is someone who instructs others, especially in the principles of the Christian faith, often in preparation for baptism or religious formation.




