## Chrism Mass

The Chrism Mass will be held at Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on April 14 at 6:30 p.m. Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives of each parish receive the blessed oils and then take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. We hope this Lent will be a Lent that changes you and pushes you to grow deeper in your faith and that Easter is a bursting of New Life brought forth!

## Did You Know?

### **Emmaus Ministry**

When you hear the name Emmaus, the first thing you may think of is the village mentioned in the Gospel of Luke. During a walk to the village of Emmaus, after Jesus' crucifixion, two disciples were joined by Jesus.

Emmaus is also the name given to a ministry that provides Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to attend Mass. Currently we have 28 Emmaus ministers at Holy Rosary and they provide Jesus to 22 homebound souls. I recently received a call from a homebound individual who was requesting the Sacrament "Anointing of the Sick". In conversation, I learned that her health had prevented her from attending Mass for nearly two years. I inquired if she would be interested in receiving Holy Communion at home. She expressed that she very much would appreciate this opportunity. If you are aware of someone who may also appreciate the opportunity to receive Holy Communion at home, please call the parish office (218-847-1393) and we will coordinate a visit from one of our Emmaus ministers.

April 13, 2025 Palm Sunday of The Passion of the Lord

### A Message From Fr. Nate

**Palm Sunday** begins the Holy Week celebration. This weekend we sing Hosanna, Thursday we celebrate the Eucharist, Friday is the veneration of the Cross, and then on Saturday night Christ breaks through the tomb and conquers death!! This week is guite a journey for all of us as we journey with Christ in his final moments on earth. If you have not been to a Sacred Triduum celebration, I invite you to consider doing it this year! Holy Thursday Mass begins at 7:00 pm. This Mass marks three significant moments of charity: Jesus washes his disciples feet, the Last Supper and institution of the Eucharist, and the priests. There is singing, homily, washing of the feet by the priest, Eucharist, and a procession. Our Good Friday service is at 3:00 pm (the hour that traditionally is associated with the hour of his death). Note: this is a change from the past years as we have 1 service. At this service, we have readings, petitions, lifting and venerating the cross, and a communion service (not a Mass). It all culminates on Saturday night with the Easter vigil at 8:30 pm! We bless the fire, the Easter candle, have an adult baptism, 4 people who will be Confirmed and receive their 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Eucharist, and celebrate Christ's victory over the grave! These holy celebrations are a high point in the life of the Church! If you have not been to any of these in the past, I highly encourage you to consider it as many people have said that these are the most beautiful moments in the Church. May you have a great finish to your Lenten journey as you get ready for the Easter Resurrection!
