

### Holy Rosary Parish is hiring two new positions! Come and be a part of our team!

We are seeking a **Coordinator of Youth Evangelization & Discipleship (CYED)** to plan, organize and implement evangelization and discipleship opportunities for youth and assist with the youth Confirmation preparation process. The CYED is part of the parish's newly formed Catechesis and Evangelization Team. This position is full-time, with a base pay of \$43,000 annually. Their work schedule is flexible and variable and includes some evenings and weekends.

### The CYED:

- Develops & implements opportunities for middle and high school youth that help them encounter Jesus Christ and his Church.
- Accompanies youth in the pre-Confirmation and post Confirmation process.
- · Recruits, trains and empowers youth and adult volunteers to serve as facilitators, small group leaders, retreat leaders and mentors.
- Recruits, trains and empowers youth and adult volunteers to serve as facilitator
   Desires to share the Kerygma, the Good News of Jesus Christ, with our youth.
- Bachelor's degree in theology, Catholic studies, pastoral ministry or a related field is helpful.
- Experience in youth ministry or religious education is valuable.
- Excellent organizational, communication and interpersonal skills.

We are also seeking a **Coordinator of Adult Catechesis (CAC)** to develop and implement opportunities for adults that foster faith growth, evangelization and missionary discipleship in the parish. The CAC is part of the parish's newly formed Catechesis and Evangelization Team. This position is part-time, 16 hours per week with a base pay of \$22.00/hour (\$18,000) annually. Their work schedule is flexible and variable and includes some evenings and weekends.

### The CAC:

- Plans and coordinates parish retreats, parish missions, Bible studies and small group studies.
- Supports the OCIA Coordinator as well as parents & sponsors of youth preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation.
- Recruits, trains and provides support to adult volunteers to teach and share the Catholic faith with adults in the parish.
- Experience as a catechist or small group faith/Bible study leader is valuable.
- Excellent organizational, communication and interpersonal skills with attention to detail & hospitality.

### A Message From Fr. Nate

**Strengthened the spirits of the disciples**. In our 1st reading this weekend, Paul and Barnabas are proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ! They also recognize that as people are living the Gospel, that it is hard work! This is the opportunity for Paul and Barnabas to build one another up.

Sports can usually provide a lot of strong images for a spiritual life. Team sports have always fascinated me: watching how they work together, supporting their teammate(s), artistry of plays and techniques, comradery with the teammates, etc. At the same time, it also becomes evident when the team is not playing well together: disorganized, pointing fingers, frustrations and anger, bad fouls or penalties, the general apathetic disposition, etc. It is important to have a few players that are good and talented, but it is important to put together a cohesive team that is moving forward.

Paul and Barnabas are using this opportunity to build up the community who have experienced some challenges. Some of the disciples have experienced setbacks by way of rejections, persecutions, disappointments, fears, and anxieties. Their encouragement is to not give up, to persevere in faith and the challenges that come along with that.

**Word of Encouragement**. It is one thing to be able to live our Catholic faith here at church: we come on Sunday, sometimes during the week, say my prayers in the comfort of the home, and maybe you're a part of a Bible study. All are good. What about the times that you live your faith outside of these moments? The times when you engage in a difficult conversation about the Catholic Church; the times when you invite someone who is experiencing some difficulties in life to pray with you; the times when we avoid certain people or situations because we know that they want to challenge our Catholic faith. **We are in this life together**. Who could use a word of encouragement in our community? What can **YOU do to build the community?** It is difficult to live our faith outside of the comfort zone, look for people that you can encourage, that you can build up, so that together we can build the Kingdom that God is inviting us to build.
