### Holy Rosary Parish is hiring one new position! Come and be a part of our team!

We are seeking a Coordinator of Youth Evangelization & Discipleship (CYED) to plan, organize and implement evangelization and discipleship opportunities for youth and assist with the youth Confirmation preparation process. The CYED is part of the parish's newly formed Catechesis and Evangelization Team. This position is full-time, with a base pay of \$43,000 annually. Their work schedule is flexible and variable and includes some evenings and weekends.

• Develops & implements opportunities for middle and high school youth that help them encounter Jesus Christ and his Church.

- Accompanies youth in the pre-Confirmation and post Confirmation process.
- Recruits, trains and empowers youth and adult volunteers to serve as facilitators, small group leaders, retreat leaders and mentors.
- Desires to share the Kerygma, the Good News of Jesus Christ, with our youth.
- Bachelor's degree in theology, Catholic studies, pastoral ministry or a related field is helpful.
- Experience in youth ministry or religious education is valuable.
- Excellent organizational, communication and interpersonal skills.

St. Vitus's feast day is June 15th. In Rome, Vitus freed the son of Emperor Diocletian from an evil spirit. When Vitus would not sacrifice to the pagan gods in celebration, his cure was attributed to sorcery. He was thrown to the lions; the lions would not touch him, so they were thrown into boiling oil. At the moment of their deaths, an immense storm destroyed several pagan temples in the region, which led to the tradition of protection against stormy weather.


His peculiar patronage though is invoked for epilepsy, chorea (St. Vitus' dance), and all other diseases connected with nervous shaking and muscular spasms. In many places Christians were encouraged to dance continuously "in honor of Saint Vitus" until they dropped from sheer exhaustion, which often cured them.

LITURGICAL PRAYER: Grant to Thy Church, we pray, O Lord, through the intercession of Thy holy Martyrs Vitus, Modestus and Crescentia, not to be proud-minded, but to grow in humility which is so pleasing before Thee; shunning the things that are evil, may she with eager love practice whatever is right.

A Message From Deacon Gary

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is the core, the foundation, the base of our Catholic faith. Every time we make the sign of the cross, we are invoking the Trinity over, around, and through ourselves. This is the most powerful, humble, simple, and identifying way that we mark ourselves to the One that we are baptized and confirmed in.

When speaking or writing about the Holy Trinity, often we dismiss it by saying, "it's a mystery!" or "I have no idea how to explain it". It is Something that we take for granted as a difficult teaching which often leads us to not exploring or diving into the Trinity. There's a famous story about St. Augustine when he was trying to figure out the Trinity. He was walking on the beach and thinking about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. There was a young boy that dug a hole in the sand and was bringing buckets of water from the ocean to fill it up. St. Augustine asked the boy what he was doing, and the young boy responded that he was filling the hole with the whole ocean. St. Augustine responded to the boy by saying, "that is impossible", and the boy shrugged his shoulders and continued. St. Augustine came to the realization that he was trying to do the impossible: take the infinite (Trinity) and pour it into his finite mind. With that, he realized he would never be able to fully comprehend the Trinity, but he was determined to keep filling his finite mind with the infinite Trinity.

The Holy Trinity is more than a mystery. God continues to reveal Himself to us as we participate in the divine life. One way that we participate in the Trinity is at Mass. The Mass is the worship where we enter God's divine life. Rather than seeing God from afar, we enter into the life of God. Our participation in the Mass is our participation in the Trinity through Wisdom, Eucharist, and being sent by the Spirit to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. When we participate in the Mass, we experience the divine life. This is how we begin to explain the Trinity; how our finite minds can begin to comprehend the infinite of God *one bucket of* water at a time!
