
Parish News and Events

A Message From Deacon Gary

Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**.

St. Augustine said, "Behold what you are, become what you receive."

At the time of procession to the front of the church to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we behold Him, Jesus. Once we receive Jesus into our body, we become what is received, Jesus.

There is much richness in the quote from St. Augustine. I am reflecting on this quote in the context of the group of 15 that served on mission in Asheville, NC the week of June 8th. The Sunday prior to giving ourselves in service to a resident recovering from Hurricane Helene, was Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church, where the Holy Spirit descends on the group of apostles and disciples to send them on mission of spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Our group received the Eucharist at the Vigil Mass and essentially sent on mission, on Pentecost Sunday.

Our first day of service through NECHAMA, the Jewish lead organization that responds to help communities recover from natural disasters, plus coordinate volunteers, such as our group; we met the CEO of NECHAMA, the Chairman of the Board and other Board members that were in Asheville for a board meeting. The Board members worked alongside us on Monday and again on Wednesday, sanding, mudding, sanding, and priming walls for paint. They also worked at a second site in Asheville, assisting another group with restoring a home. They are hands on Board Members.

The beauty of the encounter, we got to know a little bit about each other and our faith traditions. It seemed unknown to our Jewish friends, until we specifically stated this, that our Catholic traditions are rooted in the Jewish traditions. From there the relationship continued building and is expected to continue beyond that week. I am excited to have this encounter that God planned in advance. Our faithfulness to regularly receive weekly the Body and Blood of Christ and knowing the liturgical calendar of being sent on Pentecost, culminated by the work of the Holy Spirit, to be an experience, a gift that each of us received, that continues to be unpacked.

My recommendation, be prepared, as God is working regularly in each of us to have encounters similar to our group; that is a gift to be received and unpacked to further God's Kingdom on earth.


