A Message From Fr. Nate

**Sts. Peter and Paul** are the two Saints we celebrate this weekend! This is a rare year when their solemnity occurs on a Sunday, as a result, the readings and Mass prayers are for the celebration of Peter and Paul rather than the Sunday in Ordinary Time.

We heard a lot about Peter and Paul throughout the New Testament. We have many stories of triumph and failures, moments when they appear to “get it right” and then moments of “what were you thinking?!” Peter was the leader of the Apostles, and they looked to him for guidance and for decision-making. In the Acts of the Apostles, we hear that his preaching about Jesus Christ was leading to thousands of baptisms. He was a man of conviction and determination after the moment of denying Christ. After his three “yes” to the Jesus after the resurrection, Peter was “all-in” for Christ.

Paul was a man of great zeal. Through his passion for spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ, the whole world got to know Him! He was a great traveler, speaker, writer, tent-maker, and a brilliant mind. His great zeal was also tempered by his obedience to Peter. At the Council of Jerusalem, Paul stated his case and then left the decision to Peter.

These two great Saints ministered well together! They were very different in their approach and how the Lord was calling each of them, both what unites them is their love of Jesus Christ, His Church, and the desire to see others know Him. In our modern-day, may we use their prayers, their intercessions, to bring about the deep love of Jesus Christ, His Church, and bring that to others!
