A Message From Deacon Gary

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today the readings are “**IN YOUR FACE.**” Especially the 1st reading from Ecclesiastes... “Vanity of vanities ... All things are vanity!” Moving to the Gospel reading we hear of a story of unfairness with distribution of inheritance, and lastly the man that has a great harvest, so he tears down the barns to build bigger barns, only to have his life taken from him. Each of these are specific tangible items, such as the collectables we have gathered over the years, life not being fair with distribution of monies, and building structures of size... or in a cliché, keeping up with the Jones’.

Rather than reflect on these, I am shifting to different “commodity” that we all have equally right now, we don’t get more, we don’t get less each day. I suppose we can trade it when in agreement or frivolously throw it away. I know there are many variations of how this commodity is used each day. Let’s consider “time.”

We each receive an equal amount every day, 24 hours. We all have obligations that consume our time. The specific time I am pointing out is when there is time to do nothing, how is that time used?


The one that gave us our day is God. He desires we use time to build up the kingdom of God here on earth. Such as raising a family, for the single person keeping in contact with family; working for pay that gives the person dignity; recreation with others; keeping your home and yourself, neat and orderly; helping another person with a situation or task; eating and sleeping, and let’s not forget the daily interruptions. Then there are those moments in the day where there is nothing. What becomes of these times? Scrolling the phone, playing a game, watching TV or YouTube or any other app with videos.

Consider this, during these moments of nothing, whether it be 3 minutes or an hour, spend time with the one that gave you time... God. Examples of ways you may use to be with God. Say, “Thank you for this time to be with you.” Pray an Our Father or Hail Mary, as many times as this moment allows. It’s not a race, pray in a manner to soak in the words of the prayer. If you have a Holy Card, pull it out during this time. Gaze at a crucifix. Open your phone to the daily readings and reflect on the words that spark a thought. Pray for a stranger that is walking past you or for someone you know that needs prayer. Remember to pray for yourself to do God’s will. Also, remember to listen, be quiet to hear God’s movement or voice in your life.

This may seem simple, yet it’s easy to forget. The best part, you have a certain amount of control over this “commodity” that God has given you. He is looking forward to spending time with you.

We are called not to hoard but to share. True joy comes from living a grateful and generous lifestyle; become more “God-centered” and less “self-centered.”
