At least three transformations took place, the physical transformation of the home from finishing up the mudding and

Hearts transformed... our group, the homeowners, and NECHAMA, the Jewish Organization that coordinates the volunteer groups. Our group was amazed by the hope seen in the homeowners. They lost much of their physical possessions, yet, they continued to repair their home, despite six feet of rushing water passing through their home, as

Another transformation experience by the homeowners... many individuals and groups have reached out to them, such as removing the six-foot deep mudslide that landed at the back of their home, to the Mennonites building a walking bridge over the creek to reach their home, soon, that same group is planning to build a bridge for vehicles to

Another transformation is getting to know our Jewish brothers and sisters through NECHAMA. We got to know some of their experiences of antisemitism and our Jewish friends knowing more about Catholic traditions that are

Being sent out, through the Holy Spirit, transformed our lives and those we met. Going out on this mission continues to fill my thoughts with the question... "God, what is it that you wanted me to take from this experience and what is it


