A Message From Fr. Nate

"What must I do to inherit eternal life" A common question that people have pondered over many generations. A scholar of the law asked Jesus this very question. I have often wondered, "what is at the heart of the question?" One of the scripture professors that I had at seminary would often challenge us to look into the text, not just the words. So, when a scholar of the law asks the question about what he must do to inherit eternal life, I find myself looking *into* the text, not just the words!

Something that I know about myself, and many others as well, is that if I have a checklist in front of me, I am more organized and motivated to get it done. In our spiritual lives, this can take that form of all the things that I need to do, and then God will make sure to let me into heaven. Entry into heaven takes the form of making sure you have all the boxes checked. With the checklist mentality, it provides us with stability, insurance, knowledge, a roadmap, and something tangible. The challenge is that it does not require faith, almost no room for grace, and it is all about me and what I do to inherit eternal life, not what God is doing with and for us. Two trappings of the checklist spirituality: minimalism and scrupulosity.

The minimalism spirituality would go through doing the "bare minimum" so that I can be assured that I make it to heaven. It does not strive to grow, to overcome sin, to get better, they compare themselves with others and say, "I am doing better than they are", and I want to "have my cake and eat it too". The scrupulous person will constantly doubt that they are ever going to make it to eternal life. It takes the form of everything I do is mortal sin, nothing is ever right in my prayer life, "I must be doing something wrong", and they are always looking for the perfect "recipe" for the spiritual life and nothing is ever quite good enough.

Neither spirituality is very healthy. So, when Jesus gives us the story this weekend about the scholar of the law wanting to know what to do to inherit eternal life, Jesus gives the commandments AND how to live the commandments. It is more than a checklist of "things to do", rather it is a knowing what is right AND having the courage and grace to do it. We then trust that the Lord knows our heart, mind, and soul and will judge accordingly. That is why Jesus would challenge people to GROW in prayer, worship, and action. These three must go together and that is how the Lord judges us with grace and mercy; it is not an either or, but a both!




Holy Rosary Catholic School is seeking Part-Time After School Care Supervisors 3:30 - 5:30 PM 5 Days/Week
