

## A Message From Deacon Gary

#### Sixteenth Sunday Ordinary Time

We heard last Sunday, the Gospel reading of the Good Samaritan, when this Samaritan traveled, a stranger to the area, helped a man beaten by robbers and left for dead. The Samaritan aided the wounds, provided shelter and payment for his care. The Gospel reading ends with the words, "go and do likewise." Meaning to be kind, helpful, supportive, and loving to the stranger and those you meet every day.

Today, the Genesis reading we hear of Abraham offering rest and nourishment to three men on a journey. The men didn't ask for this hospitality, rather Abraham offered the hospitality. His wife Sarah made rolls, Abraham butchered a choice steer, not an average steer but a choice steer and provided curds and milk. The three men rested under the shade of a tree and ate. The encounter concludes with one of the men stating to the 90 plus year old Abraham, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah will then have a son." Remember Abraham and Sarah were childless and approaching 100 years old when the man announces that they will have a son by this time next year. A question to ponder... what if Abraham did not invite the men for rest and nourishment? Be ready, an encounter with sincere hospitality provides a rich experience.

The Gospel reading today is another encounter of hospitality... where Martha and Mary encounter Jesus. Both Martha and Mary have a specific role to play based on their unique gifts. For me, I am more of a Martha, preparing and serving but with an ear to the conversation. It's understandable, with Jesus in the room, that Mary has chosen the better part. Did you hear the words from Jesus, "Mary has chosen the better part." It doesn't mean that Martha's role is the wrong thing to do. Martha had a responsibility specific to her, preparing the meal, which is also important. Mary and Jesus couldn't have had these moments without Martha's talent to prepare the meal.

Remember Abraham's encounter inviting the three men for rest and nourishment... it changed the lives of Sarah and Abraham. Even though Abraham thought he was improving the lives of the three men.

Be ready for the unexpected encounter, it may change your life.
