A Message From Fr Nate

Jesus was praying in a certain place. Our gospel this weekend begins with the image of Jesus at a time of prayer. He knew how important it was for him to get away to a quiet place, to spend time in conversation with the Father, and to be in the presence of the Holy. Even though Jesus was fully God and fully human, he still spent time in prayer.

What I appreciate about the opening line of the gospel is that Jesus was intentional about His prayer and where He was going. There is a change that occurs when we are intentional about our prayer time (it doesn't just happen by accident, or "I pray during the day when I think about it"), and when we enter a physical space that is meant for prayer. We have heard since we were young the importance of "say your prayers!" and most understand that prayer is an important part of our lives. It is also important to have a prayer space in your home, apartment, cabin, RV, garage, or wherever you reside!

There was a moment of conversion for me when, after graduating college, I realized the importance of having a prayer space in the home. There was a dedicated room, right off the main floor, where there was religious images, spiritual reading books, scripture, crucifix, and it was a warm feeling room. I would wake up in the morning, make a cup of coffee, and go into our chapel at the house. As soon as I walked into the room, "this is the place where prayer happens". It allowed me to be focused, and it helped with consistency in praying every day. That little chapel from almost 20 years ago has had a lasting impact on me and praying intentionally. I invite you to consider setting up a chapel of sorts in your residence. Identify space, a room, an area, whatever it might be and designate that a prayer space. Set it up with religious images that are important to you: icons, painting(s), crucifix, rosary... And the most important item to that prayer space is Holy Scriptures! Every day, go to a certain place just as Jesus did! The prayer that we experience every day has an impact on those around us as you live the charity that you receive from God and you give it to others.
