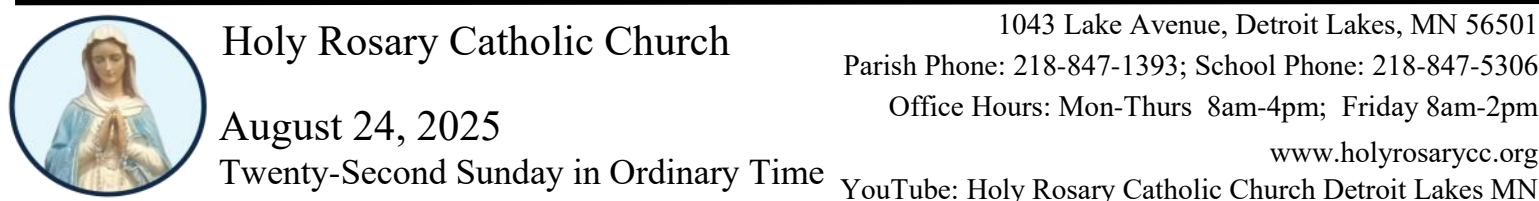

Excerpts taken from Bishop Cozzens's released statement on 8/27/2025.

“Brothers and Sisters in Christ, my heart was filled with grief and shock to hear this morning of the shooting during Mass at Annunciation School in south Minneapolis. My thoughts and prayers went immediately to the parents who lost children, and to the many children, families, and staff who have been deeply traumatized. This kind of violence is far too common in our society. We are devastated when it strikes so close to home. Jesus Christ in His Cross is the great healer. He shows us how violence can lead to love. Let us pray and work so that this transformation of love which flows from his heart on the Cross may flow through us and bring healing to our society. We will pray for an end to this violence in our world. I ask all the faithful to pray the Rosary for those who have died, those who are traumatized, and for the healing of our world.”

A Message From Deacon Gary

As the last chapter of the summer of 2025 is about to be written for us that live in Northern Minnesota. Consider reflecting on how God's hand was present in each of your joys and the sorrows of this summer. He is always present in life experiences, whether we recognize Him or not... God is there. Going forward into September, consider being aware of God's presence throughout each event of your day. Every day is different to some degree, speak with God asking for His guidance to navigate the day. He desires to be active in each of our lives, but He needs to be invited. God doesn't force himself onto you, rather we awaits our invitation.

We hear in today's first reading from Sirach, *"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God."*

How do you humble yourself? By asking God to lead you throughout your day. By getting out of His way, you are humbling yourself from thoughts such as, "I've got this!" or "The only way to get things done is to do it myself." Beginning a task with the sentiment of projecting me, myself, and I as the only solution lacks humility. The gospel reading continues to expand on the lesson being humble.

The joy resulting from being humble and surrendering your will, is that you will find favor with God. Who wouldn't want to find favor with God so He can pour out His graces on you? I know of a person that rejects these graces more often than he cares to admit. That's me. Yes, I am caught up in the cliches written earlier in this reflection... "I've got this!" or "The only way to get things done is to do it myself." Why do I reject being humble? Why do I decide to leave God out of my daily activities? Simply put... it's "pride", that deadly sin. Each day I begin with prayer and meditation, yet still, I prefer "pride" over inviting God into my daily activities. I don't have a silver bullet to overcome my lack of humility, other than to continue the journey making small changes every day, by surrendering my will, to grow closer to God.

At the beginning of this reflection, I mentioned that the month of August will be finished in a blink of the eye, for us to step into the month of September. Consider joining me to invite God into daily activities, surrender my will to God's will. Our earthly journey is short, finishing in a blink of the eye. Let's allow God to be God and we to be His children.
