## A Message From Father Nate

**Keeping our eyes fixed on the Savior** this weekend we celebrate the Cross! Above the tabernacle hangs the crucifix in our church. Whenever we enter the church and pray, often our eyes go to the cross. In many of your homes, you have a crucifix in different rooms. When entering the room, one can sense the protection of Christ.

The horror of the crucifixion of Christ has become the icon of so many people through nearly 2,000 years. Not because of the gore or the awfulness, but because of the hope that Jesus brings through His death. In the Old Testament reading from Numbers this weekend, we are reminded of the power of looking at the image that saves us. Our human tendency is to look those things that bring us down, we are often looking at the serpents in our lives, and Christ is reminding us to look at Him.

The cross is victory, not defeat. Christ shows us through His passion, His death, through the resurrection, the hope that God offers. When you are distracted by the many temptations inviting you to take your eyes off the Savior, look to the saving power of the cross. When you enter the church, look to Jesus in the tabernacle and the cross. Gaze upon the crucifix that you have in your homes; show your children how to pray in the good times and the challenges. In keeping our eyes fixed on Christ, we have strength to carry out the saving power that He offers for all! Keep you eyes fixed on Christ, not on the temptations nipping at vour heels!




