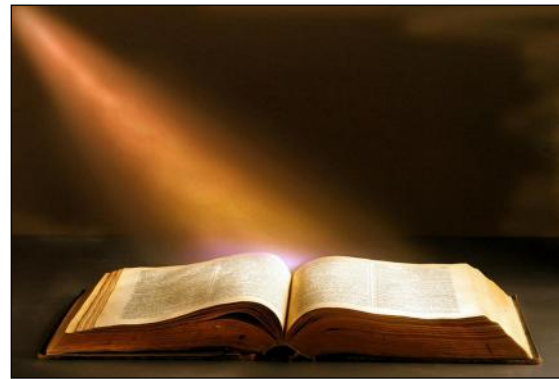

A Message From Father Nate



O God, be merciful to me a sinner is the powerful line that comes from the gospel reading of Luke this weekend. We have a moment in prayer where we see two people, two different approaches to prayer. One was a pharisee, a person who was seen as righteous; he knew how to pray, how to talk to God. It was important for him to show others how to pray and how they “ought to be” when they are in the temple. The second person is a tax collector. Someone who was seen as not knowing faith, not knowing religion, as not having a relationship with God. In the image of these two people, Jesus uses them as an example for how we ought to pray. The pharisee was caught up in himself, could not see others. The tax collector knew that he needed God’s grace and mercy and would not exist if it weren’t for God.

In seminary formation, there are three important pillars for *self* that were focused on (coming from the writing of St. John Paul II): self-knowledge, self-acceptance, and self-gift. I think a lot about this weekend’s gospel reading in-light of human formation. The tax collector was someone who knew himself (that he was a sinner, that he was not perfect, that he made mistakes). In his acceptance of who he is, he came to know that he needed a Savior, a Redeemer; he could not do it alone. He was not comparing himself to others, but he was relying on God! This became such a gift for others! We see in him so much of our own frailty, our own sinfulness. But how easy and often we take the place of the pharisee. It is easy to look around at others and judge them, to talk about people, to show how “holy” I am, how I have it all figured out. Fewer things drive people away from Church than when they walk in and feel judged.

An important question to ask of yourself, your family, those around you, how are you a person that is welcoming, that is greeting others, that is warm? We are all sinners in need of a Savior, please be sure that you greet others warmly; we never know where someone is on their journey of life; the Holy Spirit is at work in people’s lives!

Next Weekend we celebrate All Saints and All Souls! This is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year, but our Saturday evening/ Sunday morning Mass will follow the celebrations for the Saints and for all Souls. In the month of November, please pray for those who have gone before us. May they rest eternally in the arms of our loving Savior! Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them!

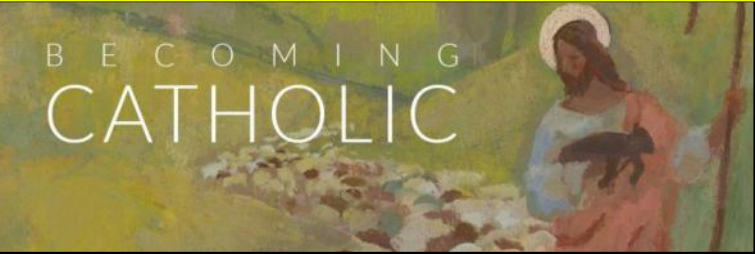


ALPHA YOUTH
