A Message From Deacon Gary

Greetings this 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, also known as the Sunday of the Word of God. A Sunday devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God. The intent of this Sunday is to emphasize devotion to the Bible in our daily lives to grow our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak His work and to break bread in the community of believers. (reference Ordo)

A daily devotion to reading scripture plus 10-15 minutes of silent reflection, allows God to make Himself known to you, when the moment is meant to happen. Be persistent with the daily period of silence; there is a moment that Jesus made Himself known to the men from today’s Gospel (may be less obvious to us!) Jesus spoke simply, “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.” How about you? Be that man or woman that engages people with the word of God. Sometimes mentioning an activity is needed to transition the discussion to the Word of God. There are many events coming up...


