A Message From Deacon Gary

Hope Lent is going well for you. Many parishioners have responded to attending the Thursday evening mini-retreat that begins with Mass and a homily structured around a virtue to counter a vice, followed by soup supper, confessions, and adoration and closing devotion. Also the 8 session small group series, Heart of Prayer, a video series lead by Bishop Cozzens, to begin the third session this week. People continue to join groups after the start of the series, feel free to join a group this week. Our Monday evening group increased by one this past week.

Here's one message from Bishop Cozzens presentation, the Heart of Prayer.

The series is structured around the prayer practices of St. Ignatius of Loyola. St. Ignatius began his life living for the world, rising to be a respected warrior and leader until a cannonball damaged his leg, then he was laid up to heal for months. During these months of healing, he continued to dream about worldly desires, especially attempting to figure out how to gain the attention of one particular woman of royalty. On the other hand, he was awed by the lives of the Saints, from a book he was given. The Saints lived a bold life with purpose such as St. Dominic, St. Francis and other Saints.

St. Ignatius came to sense different spirits when dreaming about worldly desires as compared to reading about the purpose filled lives of the Saints. The worldly ambitions were exciting to dream about but he ended that time of reflection drained of the spirit as compared to reflecting on or imagining living as one of the Saints which animated him to live with a bold purpose, with a spirit of courage. Through his continued reflection he identified these two degrees as a "discernment of spirits." A spirit that drains a person and a spirit that animates a person with a purpose. That animated purpose is tied to the purpose that God designed in him. Because during this time, unknowingly, St. Ignatius was discerning God's will for his life by reading and reflecting from another's witness, the Saints, that were also led by God. For Ignatius, a perceived bad situation, injured by a cannonball, changed the direction of his life. Ignatius had time to reflect during the months of recovery. He discovered how worldly desires sapped his spirit and he recognized living for God animated him, giving him a spirit of purpose and courage to do God's will. As a result, St. Ignatius founded the religious order we know today as the Jesuits. Not only did the cannonball injury change the direction of St. Ignatius' life, but St. Ignatius impacted the whole world through the Jesuits, such as Pope Francis, a Jesuit on mission in Argentina before being elected as Pope.

Bishop Cozzens will lead you through Ignatian Spirituality, discerning the spirits as St. Ignatius experienced so many years before us. You and I have this time to discern the spirits, listening for God's instruction, animating each of us courageously to do His will. Please consider joining one of the small groups this coming week to journey through the remaining six weeks. Peace be with you, Deacon Gary




