A Message From Deacon Gary

Lazarus, come out!

The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them "Untie him and let him go."

This Sunday and the prior two Sunday Gospel readings have similar messages. We heard about the man born blind and the woman at the well. Jesus is essentially saying to each of them, "come out," to live as the person that God had planned for you to be. Each of them needed to surrender to permit Jesus to act.

Throughout Lent we are to pray, ponder, and reflect on our relationship with Jesus. Did you have an encounter with Jesus that drew you closer to him? Well, as the TV weight loss commercial may say, "results may vary."

Yes, the results of growing closer to God during Lent will vary. Mostly because of our degree to surrender to God's plan for this Lent. Usually surrendering much to God's plan for you, results in much growth because He knows what you need. If the surrender to God's plan is minimal, then the degree of growth toward God may also be minimal.

Keep in mind, it's never too late. Consider surrendering your will to God's will these remaining weeks. Are you like the man born blind seeking to gain his sight through the hope and faith in Jesus? The man encountered Jesus and now he can see. In prayer, ask for an increase in hope and faith; God knows what is best for you and at the proper time.

Are you seeking forgiveness and freedom from sins, as the woman at the well experienced? She spoke with Jesus and He responded by releasing her burdens. Seek the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Today, Lazarus is no longer bound by illness or death, and Mary and Martha are no longer in sorrow because of the death of Lazarus. Lazarus came out of the tomb... he is no longer bound by death. We clearly hear Jesus say regarding the death of Lazarus, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Scripture continues, "And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." Believe in Jesus.

Surrender to God, allowing yourself to encounter Jesus in prayer... to see differently, to release the burden of sin and have life restored to live each day as God has planned for you.

"Lazarus, come out! Untie him and let him go."
