A Message From Deacon Gary

Happy Pentecost Sunday!!!!

This Sunday the Church, you and I, begins her mission to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Jesus said these words to the disciples shortly after the resurrection. Matt 28:19-20.

In looking at the Liturgical Calendar (the calendar year of the church that begins late November with the start of Advent), we are approximately at the halfway point. The seasons of the church to this point: Advent, Christmas, several weeks of Ordinary Time, Lent, Triduum, Easter, and now we resume the longest season of the year based on time, Ordinary Time.

Reflecting on, the six months prior to Pentecost, we were in a serious period of formation preparing us for this time following Pentecost. To be on mission spreading the Good News of Jesus resurrected from the dead; teaching everyone that the power of death has no power over us. That Satan, the evil one, does not have power over us. That the gates of heaven are open for us when our time on earth comes to an end to be in relationship with God, Our Father. The most wonderful gift of all, is that Jesus will be with us as we journey on earth, and ready to receive our sins when we give those sins to Him in confession. To walk with Jesus means the burdens are light when we are joined with Him, being in prayerful relationship with Jesus.

Monday, May 25 is Ordinary Time. How will you embrace this season? My hope is... from all the formation received from the prior six months, each of us grows deeper in faith, to bring other people to Jesus, and be Jesus to others. Also increasing your own participation in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist; expanding time in prayer or Eucharistic Adoration; possibly attend a retreat locally or in another part of the country or the world.

Locally, the Diocese of Crookston is actively recommending you register for "Rescue Live" scheduled on October 10, 2026, from 8 am – 5 pm, at the Alerus Center, Grand Forks. Fr. John Riccardo, from the Archdiocese of Detroit, MI engages participants in a greater understanding of the Gospel Message, The Good News, also known as The Kerygma. When I first heard Fr. Riccardo break open the Kerygma, I realized that I had not understood the Gospel Message correctly, even Fr. Riccardo shared publicly that he also did not have a full understanding of the Kerygma until five years ago. This man is nearing 30 years as a Priest, so most of his ordained life the power of the Gospel Message was not fully understood. Since then, Fr. Riccardo is in high demand to be heard. We are fortunate to have Fr. Riccardo within a two-hour drive and in a large, safe city. Consider signing up soon for "Rescue Live" before registration is opened to the greater United States in mid-June. People will fly or drive from all over the United States to attend. The Rescue Live events are held only twice a year. The Diocese of Crookston is pleased to host one of the events this year. Please join many from Holy Rosary that have already signed up.

Let not Ordinary Time be ordinary for you this year. Go, therefore, and make disciples...

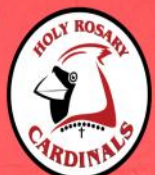
