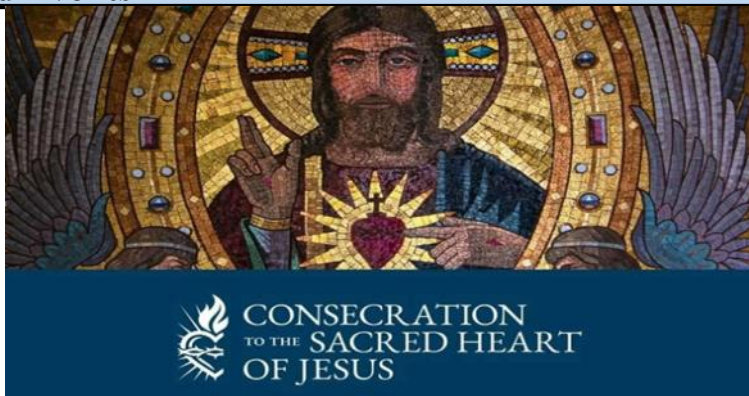

A Message From Deacon Gary

Greetings this Sunday as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

The homily given by Fr. Nate last Sunday challenged each of us to recognize the small moments that God gives to each of us throughout our day. Were you able to identify those small things in life? My hope is those small moments from God were made visible to you, resulting in greater joy in life, discovering a sense of peace, recognizing God's handywork throughout your day, giving of yourself through grateful actions or words bringing joy to another person or you received a form of kindness from another person.

Reflecting on this Sunday's Celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ are the moments experienced from the 2024 Eucharistic Congress held in Indianapolis, IN that July. The many small moments from those days...the joy, the sense of peace, recognizing God's handywork amongst the family of 60,000 Catholic brothers and sisters praying in the presence of Jesus in the large stadium. The memory of those days is wonderful.

Late last year, the Bishops in the United States announced that the 11th Eucharistic Congress is scheduled for the summer of 2029. In our lifetime we are privileged to have another gathering of Catholics to Celebrate the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist. Consider planning to join many Catholics in 2029 to give praise to Jesus, Our Savior. Specific details of the Congress are yet to be announced, be thinking about it.

The scriptures this Sunday read to me as a cliché, "Don't be that guy." You've seen examples of the cliché used in commercials, sitcoms, comedy routines or maybe amongst your own family and friends. Moses is summarizing, in our first reading today, to the people recalling the Israelites exodus from Egypt and being in the desert for 40 years. He reminds them, that God was with the people the whole time, protecting them from the army that followed, how God provided for them, yet the Israelites complained about the food, that they didn't have to prepare; their thirst for water, which God provided, and other countless things. Next, we hear in the Gospel reading words from Jesus, that he is the living bread that came down from heaven that His flesh is for the life of the world. But the Jews quarreled among themselves, questioning the words from Jesus. Scripture continues, with Jesus breaking open the meaning of His words in the remainder of today's Gospel. Appears the hearts of the people are hardened. Within 10 verses that continue in John's Gospel, the Jews make their choice, "As a result of this, many of His disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him." Leaving a small group with Jesus, the 12 disciples, because they knew Jesus is the Holy One of God and His words are life.

When we receive the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, we are receiving Jesus, the Son of God, the Creator of the Universe, the One that created each of us. Drink deeply of these words we heard in John's Gospel, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Go forth, but not as the Israelites did in the desert or the followers of Jesus that departed once hearing these words. Don't be that guy, rather give thanks to God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Meditate on these verses to receive greater understanding and meaning of the Eucharist.
